2009-2010**

Attention Students

CSU GE choices for transfer may differ between Cuyamaca and Grossmont. If you plan to attend both colleges, it is strongly recommended that you visit the Counseling Centers, check the individual colleges' websites at www.gcccd.edu for specific information, and check www.assist.org. Cuyamaca College students will be certified as completing up to 39 lower division semester units of GE for the CSU campuses upon completion of requirements for Areas A - E listed below (courses listed in more than one category may be used to certify only one requirement). Courses required in Oral Communication (A1), Written Communication (A2), Critical Thinking (A3) and Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning (B4) must be completed with grades of "C" or better for admission to most CSU campuses.

This is NOT an admission requirement, but a graduation requirement. Courses meeting this requirement may also be counted toward certification in general education (CSU GE-Breadth or IGETC). Two courses (6 units) are required. Choose Option I or Option II.</p> <p>OPTION I (Choose one course from A and one course from B): A. HIST 108, 114, 118, 122, 130, 180 B. GENERAL EDUCATION BREADTH REQUIREMENTS for the CSU 2009-2010

The California State Universities system has established a requirement of 48 semester units in general education as part of a baccalaureate degree. At least nine of the 48 units must be upper division courses. A student attending a community college may complete 39 of the 48 units prior to transfer. The 48 units are distributed as follows:

- A. A minimum of nine semester units in communication in the English language, to include both oral communication and written communication, and in critical thinking, to include consideration of common fallacies in reasoning.
- B. A minimum of twelve semester units to include inquiry into the physical universe and its life forms, with some immediate participation in laboratory activity, and into mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning and their applications.
- C. A minimum of twelve semester units among the arts, literature, philosophy, and foreign languages.
- D. A minimum of twelve semester units dealing with human social, political, and economic institutions and behavior and their historical background.
- E. A minimum of three semester units in study designed to equip human beings for lifelong understanding and development of themselves as integrated physiological and psychological entities.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) EXAMINATIONS IN CSU GE-BREADTH CERTIFICATION

AP examinations may be used in the certification of CSU General Education- Breadth requirements. Students must score 3 on an AP exam to receive credit. Check with a counselor to see how each examination clears a specific CSU GE-Breadth requirement, or check the college catalog.

Important Transfer Deadlines for CSU: Application filing period is usually done one year in advance.

Application Period:

Fall 2010 semester: October 1-November 30, 2009

Spring 2010 semester: August 1-31, 2009
