TRANSFER ADMISSION GUARANTEES (TAGS)

TAGs are agreements between a student and a university. Upon completion of prerequisites and/or requirements, the student will be granted admission to the university of their choice.

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITIES

CSU - Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT)

Applicants who earn an Associate in Arts for Transfer (AA-T) or an Associate in Science for Transfer (AS-T) degree (ADT) will be guaranteed admission into the CSU system with Junior standing.

SDSU TAG

This agreement provides an opportunity for guaranteed admission for undergraduate students transferring from community colleges local to SDSU for select majors.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

UC Schools

Grossmont-Cuyamaca has a transfer program that guarantees student admission to the following universities upon completion of requirements for select majors: UC Davis, UC Irvine, UC Merced, UC Santa Barbara, UC Santa Cruz, UC Riverside.

BACHELOR DEGREES

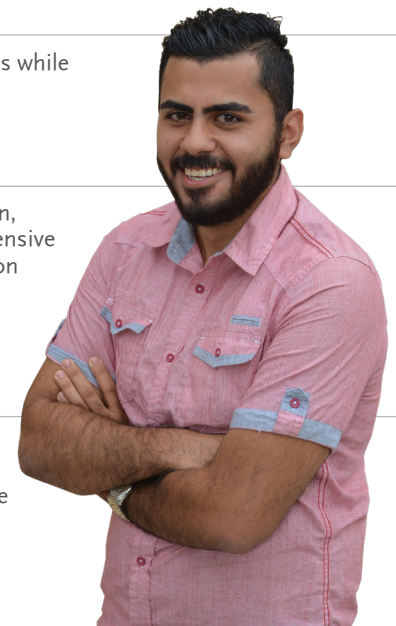
Students are able to obtain certain bachelors degrees from partnering universities while remaining on campus at Grossmont College or Cuyamaca College.

COUNSELING 150 – TRANSFER SUCCESS

This course provides information needed for transferring to a four-year institution, including study strategies and building research skills for developing a comprehensive educational plan. Topics include the community college transfer process, selection of major, student support services, comparing and contrasting a variety of universities, and clarification of one's educational goal.

Students who complete certain academic requirements are guaranteed transfer to a participating HBCU.

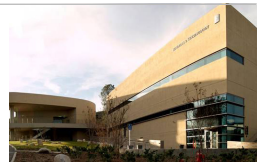

HIGH SCHOOL/COLLEGE CREDIT ENROLLMENT

TAKE COLLEGE CLASSES WHILE STILL IN HIGH SCHOOL, TUITION-FREE.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Have completed the 10th grade
- Be currently enrolled in high school
- Be at least 14 years of age
- Complete High School/College Credit Dual Enrollment Application

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

1. With help from your high school counselor, determine what college classes to take
2. Complete the Grossmont or Cuyamaca College Online Application
3. Fill out the High School/College Credit Dual Enrollment Application
 - grossmont.edu/highschoolstudent | cuyamaca.edu/highschoolstudent
 - Scroll down to “Procedures”
 - On step #2, click on “High School/College Credit Enrollment” application to download and print
 - Turn in the form to the Admissions & Records office of the college you chose with all required signatures
4. Use WebAdvisor to register for classes during the registration period
 - A new High School/College Credit Dual Enrollment Application is needed each semester
 - Upon high school graduation, let your college know so they can update your records

IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW

- Enrollment fees are waived if you’re taking less than 12 units. Other fees, such as Health, Student Center, Student Rep, and Parking Permit and fees, may still apply.
- Financial Aid may not be available for all high school students. Please contact your college financial aid office for details.

- Concurrent Enrollment will establish a permanent college record, your course grade will show up on your official college transcripts.
- It is the student’s responsibility to add or drop a course and adhere to all college deadlines. See college calendar and catalog for more details.
- Course modifications of any kind are not made for high school students.
- It is up to the high school district as to whether the courses taken under Concurrent Enrollment may be used by a student to meet high school graduation requirements.
- High school credit will be received for your college course only when you have an official transcript sent to your high school.

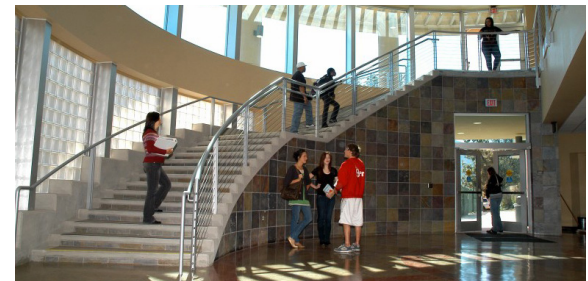
