Commendations: The Committee commends the program for completing its first individual program review this year. It is clear that the program is building infrastructure and capacity, and the Committee looks forward to reviewing its future plans.

Recommendations: The Committee recommends that the program work with the SLO Coordinator and new Outcome Assessment Committee to refine PLOs and identify ways in which assessment results can help inform program improvements.

Additional Comments: The program has recently undergone staffing changes, such that the one part-time faculty member recently shifted. The department also used to complete a program review in combination with Political Science. Now Political Science is completing a separate program review, so Anthropology may need to be combined with another discipline (if appropriate) or consider more heavily engaging its new part-time faculty member in the program review process.
