


Q: I can do something about sexual assault and sexual violence on campus.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: 15.4% and Disagreement -5.6%




Q: Sexual assault on campus is something my classmates and I need to worry about.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: 16.0% and Disagreement -8.2%




Q: Doing something about sexual assault is solely the responsibility of the police or crisis centers.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: -4.7% and Disagreement 9.3%




Q: It is my responsibility to intervene if I see a situation that could potentially lead to sexual assault.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: 6.4% and Disagreement -1.5%




Q: I would speak out if someone makes a joke about someone's body in a sexual way.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: 9.7% and Disagreement -1.8%




Q: I would speak out if someone blames a victim for being raped.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: 3.4% and Disagreement -1.3%




$Q\!\!:\!I$ am very comfortable talking to a classmate whom I suspect is in an abusive relationship.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: 15.3% and Disagreement -6.3%




Q: It is my responsibility to ask a stranger who looks very upset at a party if they are alright or need help.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: 17.4% and Disagreement -4.4%




Q: A person who is raped while drunk is at least somewhat responsible for what happened.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: -2.3% and Disagreement 5.3%




Q: A person who is drunk might rape someone unintentionally.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: 8.0% and Disagreement -1.9%




Q: If both the victim and the perpetrator are drunk, it can't be rape.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: -1.2% and Disagreement 7.2%




Q: I know a variety of strategies that can be used to intervene if I see a potentially dangerous situation.

Q: I would be more likely to intervene in a dangerous or potentially dangerous situation if I knew the person who was being victimized.


PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: 6.1% and Disagreement 0.0%


Q: I would be less likely to intervene in a dangerous or potentially dangerous situation if I didn't know the person who was being victimized.

PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: -0.0% and Disagreement 11.2%




Q: It is necessary to intervene even if I witness behavior I don't think is dangerous, such as catcalling on the street.


PRE/POST Impact Analysis - Percent Change in Agreement: 23.8% and Disagreement -7.3%




Q: Shared power in a relationship causes conflict and often leads to sexual violence.




Q: When it comes to sexual activities, consent is implied when you are in a committed relationship.
