

HED Degrees and Transfer

Eighteen degrees in our General Studies Lifelong Health and Wellbeing program have been awarded in the last 5 years. It has remained consistent awarding about 4 degrees a year.

While Cuyamaca was the first in the state to offer the ADT in Public Health (starting 5 years ago), we have had difficulty being able to award one. This is because our students want to go to SDSU and they have a transfer ready path into their Public Health program. You do not take the prescribed 60 units in the ADT for admission into SDSU. A total of 38 students since implementing the ADT have transferred. The last three years have seen 30% increases, 6, 10, 13 and as our partnership strengthens, I anticipate that number growing. We are also a microsite now with SDSU/Global and this presents some challenges in counting our students. They may just take impacted classes with us as our HED 201/202 classes are filled with a lot of SDSU Public Health majors.
