
Q1 How did you first learn about the commencement ceremony?




Q2 What is the primary reason you chose to participate in this year's commencement ceremony?

Q3 Did you experience the entire Commencement Ceremony?









He was in a wheelchair and nobody could even see the stage so none of my friends or family even saw me walk on stage to get my degree. It was a waste and stressful and made me feel crappy because I got to walk to my car by myself after the ceremony. I don't expect my 2-year-old son and my 92-year-old grandfather to sit and listen to 3 hours worth of speeches of people who I don't even know who they are and watch thousands of students walk across the stage for a certificate. There should be two separate ceremonies, one for certificates and the other for degrees. Way too many people to fit in one sitting.
3	There were a lot empty seats. You would allow people to use them.

5	Make sure that every student walking in the ceremony is actually graduating. Cuyamaca has wasted my family's time and has lied to me. 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15	Registration for commencement needs to be taken more seriously. If a student is close to meeting the requirements, but is removed from the list due to a missing requirement, staff needs to follow up with those students to ensure that they were correctly removed from the list. I had to call to speak with a counselor many times before I was told that I needed to send in a transcript for a course that I was taking during the semester of graduation. Had I not been persistent, I would have been incorrectly removed from the graduation list. Further, the commencement ceremony had WAY too many student speakers. It was too focused on the 15 (or so it felt) student speakers and not enough on the graduates as a whole. Every student has their own unique hardship-to-degree story, with many of them having to also care for a family, to just have to sit around for an hour plus to listen to the ones the college asked to speak. I highly recommend giving more credit to the students as a whole. After 5 student speakers, you've completely lost the attention of most of the attendees and students. Lastly, at the end of the commencement ceremony, holding students in their seat is a waste of everyone's time. Allow them to get up and meet up with their families as they please. No matter what, there is going to be a bit of chaos that takes place at the end of a commencement ceremony. I participated in a 4-year university commencement ceremony for another degree and they managed to make the ceremony celebratory while moving through the graduation much faster that Cuyamaca.
