AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY 200 – ASEP–ORIENTATION

Catalog Description

Introduction to the General Motors sponsored ASEP program. Students will become familiar with dealer operations. Complemented by required work experience in a dealership.

Course Objectives

Students will be able to:

- 1) Demonstrate standardized safety and hazardous waste handling practices.

- 4) Access GM training requirements and utilize CPT self-study video training and on-line training modules.

Method of Evaluation

A grading system will be established by the instructor and implemented uniformly. Grades will be based on demonstrated proficiency in subject matter determined by multiple measurements for evaluation, one of which must be essay exams, skills demonstration, or, where appropriate, the symbol system.

- 1) Quizzes, written exams, and hands-on performance exam that measure students' ability to perform necessary tasks related to safety and hazardous waste handling, new car dealership operations, and ASEP program requirements.
- 2) Observation of students' progress while performing necessary tasks related to GM training requirements, CTP self-study video training, and on-line training modules.
