Curriculum Legislation Updates

Fall 2022



AB 1111

- Common Course Numbering requires a common course numbering system in the California community colleges in order to streamline transfer. **Passed in 2021**
- Comes with 2021-22: <u>\$10</u> million and additional 2022-23 <u>\$105</u> million

Update:

To be completed by July 1, 2024: All CCCs to adopt and incorporate CCN system into course catalogs for GE required and transfer courses.

- *doesn't look like this is a firm date. More time will be needed to implement.*
- SOVA- a consultant is still working on the survey
- *Taskforce will convene in September to discuss data from survey*

Implication-AB 1111

• For Articulation:

Not all courses or comparable courses meet the same GE Areas Not all courses articulate the same to the same university

*The law is not concerned with what the course does in the university or how it articulates, only concerned with number and title!

• For Curriculum:

Begin discussing potential transition plans to renumber and retitle courses

• ASSIST, A&R

*All internal processes. Support and money allocation is key.

- Resubmission of disapproved courses has been extended to September 30, 2022 through ASSIST.
- CSU Chancellor's Office is collaborating with the UC system to get the approved courses for Area F also approved for Area 7
- •Students can take an ethnic studies course and fulfill both the graduation requirement and the GE requirements with the same course

- In July 2021, T5 was reviewed to add ES to the Minimum Requirements for the Associate Degree.
- Courses to fulfill this requirement must be offered by Fall 2024
- Taskforce drafted the core competencies for these courses. To be vetted this Fall through C-ID. Expected to be very similar to the CSU Area F and UC Area 7.
- <u>Professional Development Needs Survey</u>. By September 19
- C-ID descriptors and Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC) work is underway. (5 TMCs)

CCC Graduation Requirement

- Calls for the implementation of a <u>singular lower</u> <u>division general education pathway</u> that meets transfer requirements for both the CSU and UC systems
- (Full implementation by 2025-2026
- Requires <u>34 units</u>
- Draft is disseminated for feedback (all 3 systems are vetting the pathway)
- *ICAS will have to make a final decision by \underline{May} 2023
- **IF NOT**... administrative bodies of the CCC, CSU, and UC systems shall establish the GE pathway by December 31, 2023
- Still Accepting feedback-until October 1, 2022 Use this link <u>ASCCC portal</u>

ASCCC New Proposal

- General Education pattern for the <u>associate degree</u> that could align with the singular lower division general education pathway for transfer that's required by AB 928 (CalGETC)
- 5C (California Community Colleges Curriculum Committee) is reviewing the associate degree regulations at this time. This is one of the things they're trying to update in light of all the changes in regulations such as AB 927, 928, and 705
