## Provide a critique sandwich in each paragraph of feedback

The basic formula for constructive criticism involves three pieces:

(1)an initial compliment that acknowledges effort and intent, and notes how students benefit, (2) followed by constructive criticism that includes an examination of the evidence noting alignments and deficiencies, (3) concluding with suggestions for how to move the item to alignment (or, if aligned, how to move toward exemplary).

## Exercise the collective "We"

The collaborative effort of a team of reviewers goes into every review. You can help them in this endeavor by referring to yourself (and the review team) as "we." For instance, you might note, "While reviewing your course we noticed several links returned a 404 error indicating the URLs was no longer active." This not only makes the job of the lead reviewer lighter, it reinforces the notion that the reviews are completed by a team.
