COVID-19 VACCINE UPDATES

VA Health Care facilities are currently administering COVID-19 vaccinations for the following groups:

- VA health care personnel
- Veterans living in VA long-term facilities
- Veterans who receive care at VA and are at high risk for COVID-19 based on VA and CDC <u>risk criteria</u>
- Veterans who are at least 75 years of age
- Caregivers of veterans, if the veteran is eligible for the vaccine

If you receive care at a VA health care facility, VA will contact you once you become eligible for the vaccine. If you are not currently receiving care from a VA healthcare facility, click <u>here</u> to sign up, or contact your current health care provider for vaccine information.



COVID-19 INFORMATION

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

The following questions and answers were gathered from the County of San Diego Health and Human Services COVID-19 factsheet. More information can be found <u>here</u>.

Is the COVID-19 vaccine safe?

Yes. The vaccines underwent clinical trials with thousands of participants representing a range of diverse groups and has been deemed safe by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the U.S. Federal Drug Administration (FDA). Those with a history of reactions to immunizations are encouraged to talk to their healthcare provider prior to receiving the vaccine.

How was the COVID-19 vaccine made so quickly?

COVID-19 is not the first coronavirus. Scientists were able to apply 50 years of research to make a safe and effective vaccine, which received support for accelerated production.

How do COVID-19 vaccines work?

The Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines are messenger RNA vaccines (mRNA). mRNA provides the instructions your body needs to build a small protein that triggers an immune response to COVID-19 if you become infected.

If I have already had COVID-19 and recovered, do I still need a vaccine?

Yes, you do. There is not evidence that recovering from a COVID-19 infection builds lasting immunity in the body. Some people have been infected with COVID-19 more than once/multiple times. It is recommended you wait 90 days from recovery to receive the vaccine.

Do I still have to wear a mask after I receive the vaccine?

Yes. It will take time to vaccinate enough people for immunity in the community. In the meantime, continue to be COVIDSAFE by wearing a mask, maintaining social distance, washing your hands, and avoid large gatherings. The vaccine prevents you from getting ill from COVID-19, it does not prevent you from contracting it or spreading it.

Are there side effects?

Common side effects include soreness in your arm, fatigue, body aches and fever. These are signs the vaccine is working.

How much do COVID-19 vaccinations cost?

Free vaccinations are available from the County of San Diego (County) for all individuals currently eligible and interested in being vaccinated for COVID-19. Individuals in currently opened Phases and Tiers should first contact their medical providers to receive the vaccine directly at no-cost. For individuals unable to receive the vaccine from their provider, or if they do not have a healthcare provider, they may be vaccinated at a County-coordinated COVID-19 vaccination site at no-cost.

How do I find out if I am eligible?

Updates on who is eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine will be posted on the COVID-19 Vaccine page on https://coronavirus-sd.com/vaccine. Additionally, depending on what group you fall into, you may be notified by your healthcare provider.

VIRTUAL DROP-INS

If you would like to sign-in to see an academic counselor for 10-15 minutes, please click <u>here</u>, see the availability of the counselor, click the appropriate hour and enter the Zoom waiting room; the counselor will be with you shortly after that. These are not scheduled appointments, these are drop-ins so you need to enter the room during the hour you are selecting, the same way you would see a counselor as a drop-in when on campus. You cannot pre-schedule these appointments.

If you have any questions about your student educational plan and would like to schedule a 60 minute appointment with a veteran's academic counselor, please click <u>here</u> to schedule. - <u>Grossmont College Guest Intent Form</u> (if you are also taking classes at Grossmont this semester).
- If you have changed your major, you will need to provide a One Semester Educational Plan or a new Comprehensive Educational Plan. The educational plan must be submitted with the semester worksheet. If you are a continuing student and have not submitted a Comprehensive Educational Plan you will need to provide a copy before enrollment will be certified to VA. EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE FUND

For students who are experiencing a financial emergency due to COVID-19, please click <u>here</u> to apply for an emergency grant.

Receive a \$500 grant each semester that you are an active student. Grant is not a part of you Financial Aid or your VA Benefit. Eligibility: Current Cuyamaca student who has not previously received the grant from either Cuyamaca College OR Grossmont College in the same semester.

Cuyamaca College has exhausted it's CARES Act funding. However, you are still encouraged to apply as all applicants are being placed on a waitlist until more funding becomes available.

No applications will be discarded, you will not lose your place in line if you have already applied.
