<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A minimum “C” grade is required in each college course for Cal-GETC. A “C” is defined as a minimum 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale. Grades of “C-” are not acceptable. A grade of “P” in approved coursework at GCCCD is acceptable for certification. Some CSU and UC campuses may have limitations on the number of P/NP units that may be used to meet degree requirements. Courses or exams may be listed in more than one area but will not be certified in more than one area. Each course must have a minimum 3 semester unit or 4 quarter unit value. An * indicates transfer credit may be limited: (1) No credit given for courses taken out of sequence. (2) Credit may be limited for courses with overlapping content. See Cuyamaca College catalog and www.assist.org for credit limitations. Students with catalog rights prior to Fall 2025 may follow the CSU GE Breadth or IGETC. See a Counselor for help in selecting the GE pattern that works best for your goals.
