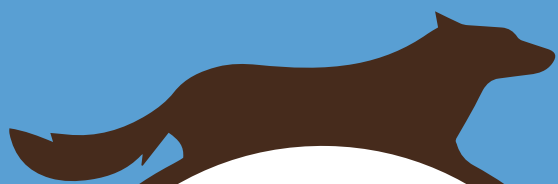


**America

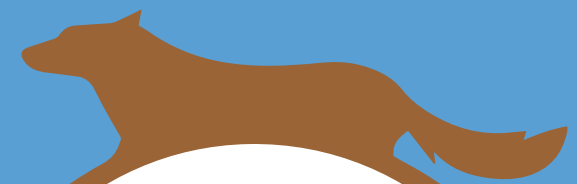


**Bad Bunny:

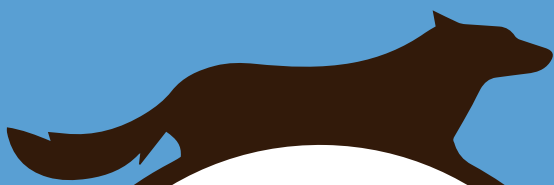
