


Aid students to understand and use transition sentence in writing.

Strategy

How to write strong transition sentences?

Steps of Developing transition sentences

Step 01

Choose explicit words; avoid pronouns.

Step 03

Make sure the transition sentence matches the flow of the writing.

Step 05



Find the specific connections between ideas or paragraphs.

Step 02

Write the transition sentence that can link ideas/paragraphs together with explicit words.

Step 04

If it doesn't match, try clarifying the specific connections.



Paragraph X: points that support the view that 8-hour sleep is necessary.

Transition: Despite the previous arguments, many researches indicate that 8-hour sleep is not as needed as typically believed for adults.

Paragraph Y: points that contradict the view that 8-hour sleep is necessary.

(Typical Main Paragraph Structure:

Topic sentence + Different Points with Evidences & Explanations + Transition sentence)

Normally, transition sentence for paragraphs is located at the end of the first paragraph.



Choices of Explicit Words

Relationship Words to choose from

Similarity also, in the same way, just as, so too, likewise, similarly

Contrast however, in spite of, nevertheless, nonetheless, in contrast, still, yet

Sequence first, second, third, next, then, finally

Time after, at last, before, currently, during, earlier, immediately, later,

meanwhile, now, recently, simultaneously, subsequently, then

Example for example, for instance, namely, specifically, to illustrate, such as

Emphasis even, indeed, in fact, of course, truly, more/most importantly

Position above, adjacent, below, beyond, here, in front, in back, nearby

Cause/Effect accordingly, consequently, hence, so, therefore, thus

Additional Support additionally, again, also, as well, besides, equally important, further,

furthermore, in addition, moreover

Conclusion finally, briefly, in conclusion, in the end, in the final analysis, on the whole, to conclude, to

summarize, in summary

How to make sure that the transition sentence works?

Success Check



Tutors

Tutors can check students' understanding on the subject by giving students a quick test. For instance, come up with two ideas and ask students to generate a transition sentence.



Students


Students can always conduct a self-check. The simplest method is to read the finished transition sentence out loud, checking if it makes sense, if it connects the pervious and the later ideas, if it is detailed enough...

Guiding Principles

❖ Be patient. Tutors need to give students time to understand and practice. Students should be prepared to learn and practice.

❖Be communicative. Tutors should pay attention to students' verbal and non-verbal language. Students should acknowledge that tutors are there to help.

❖ Be sincere. Tutors are aiming for students' independence, explaining one concept in different ways might be needed. Students should ask for clarification or suggestions whenever in doubt.
